

RESIDENT STUDENT DORMITORY CHECKLIST

2009-2010 School Year

Ought to have:

- Personal clothes, shoes, coats, etc.
- Personal hygiene items
- Mattress pad, sheets, pillow cases, blanket(s), bedspread (single size bed)
- Towels (include at least two large bath towels), washcloths, etc.
- Toiletries
- Wastebasket
- Study lamp
- Laundry bag or basket for dirty laundry
- Athletic clothing for physical education
- One pair of good athletic shoes for exclusive use on the gym floor
- Winter clothing—warm mittens or gloves, cap or hat, jacket, boots, etc.
- Masking tape for mounting wall coverings

Nice to have:

- Drinking glass
- Basic eating and cooking utensils for use with dormitory microwaves
- Small fan
- Hot pot for heating water or soup
- Lingerie bag
- Foot locker (combination or extra key for lock is given to dormitory supervisor)
- Sweats
- Bookends
- Alarm clock (cell phones are deposited with the dorm parent overnight)

Don't bring:

- Refrigerator; microwave or any cooking unit other than hot pot and/or coffee maker
- Candles and incense burners
- Posters that are in poor taste (e.g., that display or promote immodesty, alcohol, tobacco, drugs)—use Christian judgment
- Weapons (except those intended for hunting—they must be checked in with the dorm parent for storage)
- Laser pointers
- Pets *of any kind*
- Barbells (dumbbells are OK, but pads approved by the dorm parent are required)
- Music with Parental Advisory Explicit Content label or that is otherwise offensive—use Christian judgment
- Videos or DVDs with a rating other than G, PG, or PG-13 and video games with a rating other than EC, E, E10+, or T; use Christian judgment also with these

- All personal items should be labeled.
- All South Hall and West Hall room doors have a 4" metal strip attached beneath the room number: magnetic mounting is the only permitted method of mounting a message board onto these room doors. Nothing other than a magnetic mounted message board may be attached to the exterior or interior surfaces of South and West Hall doors—no masking tape, either.
- Make arrangements for transfer and safekeeping of spending money (a student bank is available).
- This list addresses dormitory needs only. Don't forget items needed for school work.
- You need to supply your own personal consumables (facial tissue, detergent, etc.).
- If you bring a bicycle, you must remove it when you leave at the end of the school year. If you don't, it will be considered forfeited and be disposed of. The bike rack is not sheltered.
- Space is at a premium in the dormitories. Be considerate of your roommate's needs and pack accordingly.
